Submission Requirements

Student projects may be submitted online, through postal mail, or dropped off at the clinic or via email. All entries must be returned with the contest entry form which is available at riordanclinic.org/health-is-contest-information.

Submissions will be judged on

- Originality
- Motivational impact
- Clarity
- Emphasis on health (not disease)

All submissions will become the property of the Riordan Clinic and will not be returned to the student. Riordan Clinic reserves the right to use all projects in promotions but commits to credit the student for their original work.

Categories

ESSAY: 200 words describing what health means to you

TECHNOLOGY: 3-5 minute video, slideshow or other media interpretation

ART: any form of original art work along with a statement of why the piece of art explains what health means to you

Students may enter multiple projects and categories but can only win one category/prize per year.
